IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Revenue Fund of the County for the month of January, 1962, amounting to \$ 9,373.75 , be allowed and checks numbering 2419 to 2501, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the General Revenue Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered that the salary of \$166.66 be paid to the Dog Warden and that mileage of \$105.00, and that the claims amounting to \$ 25.68 be allowed, and checks numbering D-152 through D-159, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the Dog Fund of said County.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT, MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1962.

F. E. Jones, Treasurer having submitted a written financial report, same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of February, 1962.

IN RE: FIRE NOVEMBER 28, 1961, HEALTH CENTER.

The Clerk in compliance with resolution of December 1st having contacted Mrs. Margaret R. Tucker concerning a small fire in the basement of the Health Center on November 28th, 1961, and Mr. J. E. Howard Jr. Branch Manager of General Adjustment Bureau, Petersburg, Virginia, having offered settlement on behalf of the insurance company for this fire in the amount of \$67.20 based on the following: Repairs of furnace, \$17.20; Cleaning and painting furnace room \$50.00, total \$67.20,

Motion was duly made and carried that this offer be accepted.

IN RE: COUNTY AUDIT BY HARRY N. JAMES COMPANY.

A letter from the auditor of Public Accounts dated January 24, 1962, was read accepting the audit of the accounts and records of the County of Dinwiddie and Francis E. Jones, Treasurer by Harry N. James Company, for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1961.

IN RE: PLAT JAMES A. MUSGROVE PROPERTY.

Mr. James A. Musgrove having presented a plat of one lot containing 20,000 square feet on Rt. 714,

Motion was duly made and carried that upon approval of the Health Department same be accepted by this Board and recorded in the Clerk's Office.

IN RE: C. E. FABLE ROAD.

Mr. C. E. Fable having appeared before the Board and requested that the road beginning at a point on Rt. 614, .25 miles east of Rt. 142 shown on plat in the Clerk's Office in Dunedin Subdivision, be taken into the secondary road system,

Motion was duly made and carried that this be referred to the State Highway Department for report at the next meeting.

IN RE: PETITION OF PERCY ABERNATHY AND OTHERS, ROUTE 609.

A petition signed by land owners and users of Route 609 from Route 619 to Route 626, a distance of 4½ miles having been presented requesting that the Highway Department daylight the curves, widen and hard surface this road,

Motion was duly made and carried that Route 609 be prepared for surfacing and placed in the 1962-63 budget for hard surfacing.

IN RE: ROUTE 607.

Mr. Jerry Blaha and others having appeared before the Board and requested that repairs be made to Route 607 from Route 604 to the Prince George County line,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Highway Department be requested to make tentative surveys to the right of way and work needed and report at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: PRELIMINARY PLAT OF MANSFIELD SUBDIVISION

A preliminary plat of Mansfield Subdivision situated in Namozine District about 1 mile west on River Road having been presented for tentative approval of the general layout and street design. Lots to be actually subdivided and presented in final form for approval being Block C, Lots 1 through 9 and followed by Block B lots 1 through 6.

Motion was duly made and carried that the preliminary sketch be referred to the Department of Highways and the Department of Health for investigation and report at the next meeting.

IN RE: RADIO-PURCHASE FOR CARS 81 AND 82.

A. Hill Burton having presented exchange price of \$1863.50 for two Motorola Police Car Radios to be installed on cars #81 and 82,

Motion was duly made and carried that he be directed to purchase same for the County.

IN RE: RADIOS FOR NAMOZINE FIRE DEPARTMENT.

Roy L. Coleman from Namozine Fire Department having requested the two used radios to be replaced on cars #81 and 82, for the Namozine Fire Department and A. Hill Burton having reported that the Motorola Company would sell the old radios to the county for \$25.00 each,

Motion was duly made and carried that the old radios be purchased for Namozine Fire Department.

IN RE: REPAIRS TO JAIL BEDS.

A. Hill Burton, Sheriff having requested permission to repair the beds in the jail and it appearing that the cost of repairs would not exceed \$12.00 each,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Sheriff have this work done.

IN RE: SALARY OF GORDON ANDREWS AS JANITOR.

Upon application of Gordon Andrews, Janitor for county buildings,

Motion was duly made and carried that his salary be increased 5% which would total \$1260.00 for the year.

IN RE: DEPARTMENT OF WELFARE BUDGET.

Mr. Fred Tunnell, Superintendent of Welfare having presented the tentative budget for the fiscal year 1962-63,

Motion was duly made and carried that same be filed for consideration with the county informative budget.

IN RE: JAMES EMERY - AUTOMOBILE GRAVE YARD.

James Emery, Route 3 Box 430, Petersburg, Virginia, having applied for a permit to operate an automobile grave yard in Dinwiddie County and same having been referred to the County Planning Commission for investigation and report and the Planning Commission having suggested that this permit be denied. Action on same is deferred for further study.

IN RE: STREET LIGHT REQUEST ROUTE 714.

Mr. James Musgrove and others having requested the installation of three street lights on Route 714,

Motion was duly made and carried that consideration of this request be deferred until more buildings are erected.

IN RE: APPOMATTOX RIVER WATER AUTHORITY REQUEST.

D. C. Mayes having appeared before the Board as a representative of Appomattox River Water Authority and requested that appropriation of \$2,000.00 be made for use by the Appomattox River Water Authority, said \$2,000.00 to be repaid when and if the Authority issues and sells bonds for the proposed dam,

Motion was duly made and carried that the request be granted.

IN RE: CENTRAL STATE HOSPITAL SURPLUS LAND.

The Appomattox Basin Industrial Development Corporation having informed this Board that Central State Hospital has declared as surplus property a tract of land amounting to 44.3 acres bordering on the north by the Toll Road Authority; on the east by the Seaboard Air Line Railroad; on the south by Boydton Plank Road and requesting that this land be restricted to industrial development,

Motion was duly made and carried that the same be referred to the Planning Commission for study and report.

IN RE: INTERIM ZONING ORDINANCE RENEWAL.

It appearing to the Board that Interim Zoning Ordinance adopted on _____ should be renewed,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Clerk and the Commonwealth's Attorney prepare the proper notice and publish same in the Southside Virginia News for the renewal of this ordinance.

IN RE: DOG TAG NOTICE.

The Clerk was instructed to place proper notice in the news paper to the effect that the Dog Warden will begin issuing warrants to the owners of all dogs found without dog tags on and after February 5, 1962.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
