IN RE: READING OF THE MINUTES.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Revenue Fund of the County for the month of April, 1962, amounting to \$6,413.61 be allowed and checks numbering 2697 through 2786, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the General Revenue Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered that a salary of \$166.66 be paid to the Dog Warden and that \$105.00 be paid to him as mileage for the month of April, and that claims amounting to \$46.25 be paid out of the Dog Fund of the County for the month of April, 1962, and checks numbering D-169 through D-176, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the said Dog Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT.

F. E. Jones, Treasurer having submitted a written financial report same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of May, 1962.

IN RE: AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 5-4-1-D OF DINWIDDIE COUNTY SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE.

Mr. L. C. Harrison, Jr. County Sanitarian having presented a proposed amendment to the subdivision ordinance upon motion duly made and carried the Clerk is requested to place the following notice in the Southside Virginia News, to-wit:

DINWIDDIE COUNTY CITIZENS  
NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held at the Agricultural Building at Dinwiddie, Virginia, on the 1st day of June, 1962, at 2 o'clock P. M. at which time and place all shall be heard for or against the following proposed amendment to the subdivision ordinance of Dinwiddie County: SECTION 5-4-1-D:

The agent shall not approve any subdivision where sanitary sewers are not provided unless the agent shall receive in writing a preliminary approval from the health official, a statement to the effect that the area contained in the subdivision is generally satisfactory for the installation of septic tanks, and that they will not create hazards to public health. This is a preliminary approval only. An additional approval must be given in writing by the use of the Local Health Service form No. 121-Permit To Install or Repair Water Supply and/or Sewage Disposal Systems - on each individual lot as development and building progresses. This permit must be obtained prior to receiving a building permit. The above requirements shall be noted on the Health Department's approval on all subdivision maps.

IN RE: APPLICATION FOR LOAN FROM LITERARY FUND.

WHEREAS, The School Board for the County of Dinwiddie, on the 4th day of May, 1962, presented to this Board or Council, an application addressed to the State Board of Education of Virginia for the purpose of borrowing from the Literary Fund \$100,000. for the new school building at Church Road, Va., to be paid in 20 annual installments, and the interest thereon at 3 per cent paid annually.

RESOLVED, That the application of the County School Board to the State Board of Education of Virginia for a loan of \$100,000. from the Literary Fund is hereby approved, and authority is hereby granted the said County School Board to borrow the said amount for the purpose set out in said application.

The Board of Supervisors for said County will each year during the life of this loan, at the time they fix the regular levies, fix a rate of levy for schools or make a cash appropriation sufficient for operation expenses and to pay this loan in annual installments and the interest thereon, as required by law regulating loans from the Literary Fund.

IN RE: WATER PUMP FORD VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT.

The Ford Volunteer Fire Department having requested that the pump in the old Ford Fire engine be repaired or replaced and the Board being of the opinion that it would be best to replace same,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Clerk order from Charles E. Baker, Roanoke, Virginia, one American Marsh Auxiliary Booster Pump for \$378.00.

IN RE: PHONE EXTENSION FORD VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT.

The Ford Volunteer Fire Department having requested that an extension from the Ford Fire House to Mayes Lewis' Garage be installed,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Clerk instruct C. & P. Telephone Company to install same.

IN RE: LAWN MOWER FOR AGRICULTURE BUILDING.

Mr. B. F. Bedwell having requested permission to purchase a lawn mower to be used around the agricultural building and health building,

Motion was duly made and carried that this request be granted.

IN RE: MANSFIELD SUBDIVISION PLAT OF SECTIONS B & C.

Plats of Section B & C of Mansfield Subdivision having been referred to the Department of Health and the State Resident Engineer for their inspection and report, and it appearing that both departments have approved same,

Motion was duly made and carried that this Board approves the plats of Section B & C of Mansfield Subdivision as presented with the requirement that each lot must have the approval of the Department of Health prior to the issuance of a building permit and the Clerk is directed to admit these plats to record when so requested.

IN RE: GENTRY SUBDIVISION PLAT.

A plat of Gentry Subdivision having been referred to the Department of Health and the State Resident Engineer for their inspection and report, and it appearing that both departments have approved same,

Motion was duly made and carried that this Board approves the plat of Gentry Subdivision as presented with the requirement that each lot must have the approval of the Department of Health prior to the issuance of a building permit and the Clerk is directed to admit this plat to record when so requested.

IN RE: INTERSECTION OF ROUTE 610 AND ROUTE 40.

Mr. W. C. Tucker, Chairman of the McKenney Ruritan Highway Committee having appeared before the Board and requested that Route 610 at its intersection with Route 40 be relocated so as to cause a less hazardous approach and Mr. H. A. Fennell, Resident

Engineer being present, suggested that the Ruritan Committee meet with him at this intersection on May 10th at 4 o'clock P. M. to make a study of this problem and report at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: CONFINEMENT OF JUVENILES IN PETERSBURG JAIL.

During the discussion of the jail report made by the Department of Welfare and Institutions dated April 12, 1962, it was brought out that a juvenile prisoner was confined in the county jail,

On motion duly made and carried the Sheriff is hereby instructed to confine all juveniles in the Petersburg jail.

IN RE: PUBLIC AND INSTITUTIONAL PROPERTY INSURANCE.

Mrs. Margaret Rives Tucker having suggested that a savings of approximately 20% could be incurred by reappraising the value of the Dinwiddie County Court House, jail and offices and placing the insurance under the new Public and Institutional Property Program,

Motion was duly made and carried that the Chairman of the Board and the Clerk have this property reappraised and report at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: CIVIL DEFENSE SHOT GUNS RETURNED.

The auxiliary police of the Dinwiddie County Civil Defense Unit having requested that the Civil Defense shot guns which were loaned to the Brunswick Civil Defense unit be returned and made available for their use,

Motion was duly made and carried that all civil defense shot guns be stored in the jail to be used by the Dinwiddie County Civil Defense unit.

IN RE: STREET LIGHT RITCHIE AVENUE, MAITLAND VILLAGE.

A petition signed by William J. Floyd and others requesting a street light to be installed on Ritchie Avenue in Maitland Village having been received,

Upon motion duly made and carried, M. G. Chandler is requested to meet with a representative of Virginia Electric & Power Company to investigate the need of this street light and report at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: REQUEST FOR TECHNICAL TRAINING COURSES AT RICHARD BLAND COLLEGE.

The Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County being of the opinion that there is an urgent need for technical training courses to be offered in this area,

Upon resolution unanimously adopted the Board requests the Board of visitors of the Colleges of William and Mary to consider the provisions for a technical institute to be phased into the educational program of the Richard Bland College as early as practical.

IN RE: LEVY RATE FOR 1962.

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Dinwiddie, Virginia, that there be, and is hereby levied, for the year 1962, a tax of \$2.50 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation on all taxable real estate located in this County, and that there be, and is hereby, levied, for the year 1962, a tax of \$2.50 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation on all taxable tangible personal property located in this County on January 1, 1962, the respective levies hereby ordered being also applicable to the real estate and tangible personal property of public service corporations, based upon the assessment thereof fixed by the State Corporation Commission and duly certified.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that such taxes, when and if appropriated by the Board of Supervisors of this County, shall be used to defray the County charges and expenses and all necessary charges incident to or arising from the execution of the lawful authority of the Board of Supervisors of this County.
