IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS AND SALARIES.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the salaries and accounts against the General Revenue Fund of the County for the month of August, 1962, amounting to \$11,509.74 be allowed and checks numbering 3053 through 3157, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the General Revenue Fund of the County, said claims having been audited and approved by the Board.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE AGAINST THE DOG FUND OF THE COUNTY.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered that a salary of \$166.66 be paid to the Dog Warden, and that \$105.00 be paid to him as mileage for the month of August, out of the Dog Fund of the County, and checks numbering D-194 through D-198, both inclusive, be issued, therefor, payable out of the said Dog Fund of the County. Claims amounting to \$19.90 were ordered paid.

IN RE: TREASURER'S REPORT.

F. E. Jones, Treasurer having submitted a written financial report same was ordered filed with the papers of the Board for the month of September, 1962.

IN RE: DOG TAGS.

Mr. F. E. Jones, Treasurer informed the Board that several of the counties in the State had set a price of \$2.00 for all male and female dog license in lieu of the present rate of \$1.00 for male and \$3.00 for female tags.

IN RE: HOSPITAL CONTRACT - UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA.

A contract with University of Virginia Hospital to provide hospitalization and treatment of indigent or medically indigent persons at the rate of \$26.79 per day having been presented,

Motion was duly made and carried that the contract be accepted and executed by the chairman of this Board.

IN RE: TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM AUTO TO GENERAL FUND.

Upon a request of F. E. Jones, Treasurer, motion was duly made and carried that \$25,000.00 be transferred from the Auto License Fund to the General Fund of the County.

IN RE: COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE REPORT ON MACHINE AND TOOLS vs. MINERAL RIGHTS.

R. W. Bridgman, Commissioner of Revenue, was requested to make a study of the machine and tool tax as compared to mineral rights tax and report at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: CARSON FIRE DEPARTMENT, CAPITAL OUTLAY.

The Carson Fire Department having requested appropriation of \$300.00 for capital outlay to be used in the purchase of a pump for their fire truck,

Motion was duly made and carried that this appropriation be granted.

IN RE: W. L. MITCHELL PLAT.

The final plat of property owned by W. L. Mitchell having been presented,

Motion was duly made and carried that the same be approved and the Clerk is directed to admit the plat to record when so requested.

IN RE: DEEPENING THE JAMES RIVER CHANNEL.

It appearing to the Board that the commission created by the 1962 session of the General Assembly, to study matters pertaining to the James River will hold a hearing in the City of Hopewell, Virginia, on October 4th, 1962, and

This Board being of the opinion that the deepening of the James River channel from the City of Richmond to the Hampton Roads area to a depth of thirty-five feet as approved by the United States Army Corp of Engineers is of vital importance to the future industrial development of the James River Basin and will be a major step forward in the accomplishment of the state wide program proposed and undertaken by the Honorable Albertis S. Harrison, Jr., Governor of Virginia, for the economic growth of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Commission established by the General Assembly of Virginia and appointed by the Governor of Virginia to study matters pertaining to the James River is urgently and respectfully requested to report to the Governor of Virginia favoring the deepening of the James River Channel from Richmond, Virginia, to the Hampton Roads area, to a depth of thirty-five feet.

IN RE: STREET LIGHTS WESTWOOD SUBDIVISION-ROCKDALE ROAD.

M. G. Chandler having investigated a request for the installation of street lights in Westwood Subdivision and it appearing from his report that the needs can best be met by installing one 2500 lumen street light on pole #3 and one 3300 mercury vapor street light on pole #33 and removing the 2500 lumen street light now installed on pole #1,

Motion was duly made and carried that Virginia Electric and Power Company make the installations and removal as shown in the report.

IN RE: PETITION FOR STREET LIGHTS, SOUTHERN PINES.

A petition signed by Mrs. L. R. Moseley, of RFD, Petersburg, Virginia, and others, requesting that street lights be installed in Southern Pines having been received,

Motion was duly made and carried that M. G. Chandler meet with a representative of Virginia Electric and Power Company to investigate the need of these lights and report at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: PETITION FOR STREET LIGHTS - DINWIDDIE GARDENS.

A petition signed by Mr. J. L. Pearce and others, requesting that street lights be installed in Dinwiddie Gardens Subdivision having been received,

Motion was duly made and carried that M. G. Chandler meet with a representative of Virginia Electric and Power Company to investigate the need of these lights and report at the next Board meeting.

IN RE: SANITARY DISTRICT - NAMOZINE DISTRICT.

Mr. Garnett O. Lee, Jr. with Anderson and Strudick and Mr. Paul P. Wisman with Francis I. DuPont & Company appeared before the Board and discussed the possibility of setting up Namozine District as a sanitary district for the purpose of installing a water system followed by the installation of a sewage system at a later date. After some discussion they agreed to look into the matter further and file a report with the Board.

IN RE: HEATING SYSTEM, COURTHOUSE, CLERK'S OFFICE & JAIL.

The chairman and clerk, as directed by the Board members having requested bids to replace the coal burning furnace in the basement of the Courthouse with an oil burning furnace and the fol-

IN RE: LOCATION OF ROUTE 85 NEAR PETERSBURG AIRPORT.

It appearing to the Board that the suggested location of Rt. 85 near Petersburg Airport will place this road quite a distance from said airport. And this Board being of the opinion that the location of said Route 85 as shown on copies of plats given the Board members, at a previous meeting with the Highway Department, designated as follows:

F-Station 22 to Station 23; F3-Station 23 to Station 24; F2-Station 24 to Station 25 with interchange at Route 613,

would locate Route 85 nearer the Petersburg Airport property, which is one of the best industrial locations in the county,

Motion was duly made and carried that the State Highway Department be requested to approve these changes in the location on Route 85 through Dinwiddie County.
