IN RE: MINUTES.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

IN RE: ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS.

On motion of Mr. Chandler, seconded by Mr. Smith and carried, it is ordered by the Board that the accounts against the General Fund of the County for the month of October, 1967 amounting to \$23,299.51 be allowed and checks numbering 67-1021 thru 67-1137, both inclusive be issued therefor payable out of the General Fund of the County and said claims have been audited and approved by the Board. (The above motion was carried 3-2. Mr. Smith, Mr. Chandler and Mr. Meredith, who voted as the representative from Rowanty District, voted "aye", Mr. Hauser and Mr. Winn voted "no").

IN RE: A. H. RICHARDSON - SALARY OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS.

Honorable Arthur H. Richardson, member of the House of Delegates appeared before the Board and stated the School Board Members receive a maximum of \$240.00 per year. Mr. Richardson offered to introduce proper legislation in the General Assembly to have their salaries raised to any amount the Board of Supervisors suggested. This subject was deferred until the next meeting.

IN RE: A. H. RICHARDSON - REQUEST FOR COUNTY LAND FILL.

The Hon. Arthur H. Richardson appeared before the Board and requested the Board provide one or more sanitary landfills in the County of Dinwiddie. The vice chairman stated the County would purchase land suitable for a land fill if it were available. No further action was taken.

IN RE: ORDINANCE TO CONTROL TARGET RANGES ADOPTED EFFECTIVE
JANUARY 1, 1968.

This being the date and time set to hold a public hearing to consider adoption of an ordinance to control and/or prohibit target rifle ranges in Dinwiddie County and the Board heard all who wished to speak.

After discussion Mr. Smith moved the following ordinance be adopted. Mr. Chandler seconded and the motion carried 4-1 (Mr. Smith, Mr. Chandler, Mr. Winn and Mr. Meredith voted "aye", Mr. Hauser voted "no").

AN ORDINANCE TO CONTROL AND PROHIBIT THE CONSTRUCTION
AND/OR OPERATION OF PISTOL, RIFLE, AND SHOTGUN TARGET RANGES
WITHIN THE LIMITS OF DINWIDDIE COUNTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE DINWIDDIE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS.

- 1 - It shall be unlawful for any person, landowner, organization or individual to construct or operate any rifle, pistol or shotgun target range within the limits of Dinwiddie County without written approval by the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County. Such approval may be obtained upon application as hereinafter provided.

- 2 - Such application shall be obtained from the Executive Secretary's Office and shall be submitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and placed on the agenda of the Board to be presented at the next regular scheduled meeting of the Board, notice of which shall be given in writing to the applicant.
- 3 - The Board of Supervisors in its discretion shall grant or deny its approval by proper resolution not less than twenty-eight (28) days from date of presentation to the Board.
- 4 - Approval for the construction and/or operation of said range if granted by the Board of Supervisors shall be issued for a period of twelve (12) months renewed at the option of the Board upon proper application as herein provided.
- 5 - The physical construction of any such target range shall be in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the Board of Supervisors which such rules and regulations may be changed from time to time.
- 6 - Any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00); and any such person who shall be convicted hereunder for a second or subsequent offense shall be punished by a fine not to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300.00), or by imprisonment in jail not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- 7 - This ordinance shall become effective January 1, 1968.

IN RE: AUDIT REPORT YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1967.

Mr. William Bristow representing V. Lee Parker and Co., presented and discussed with the Board the audit of the County for the year ending June 30, 1967.

IN RE: AUDIT BY V. LEE PARKER AND COMPANY FOR YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1968.

V. Lee Parker and Company submitted a written proposal to audit the County books and records for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968 in conformity with the Auditor of the Public Accounts for \$1,000.00 furnishing the usual number of copies.

Mr. Chandler moved that V. Lee Parker and Co. be contracted to conduct the audit for the year 1967-68. Mr. Smith seconded. The motion was carried.

IN RE: COMMISSIONER OF THE REVENUE - ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION APPROVED.

Mr. R. W. Bridgman Commissioner of the Revenue appeared before the Board and requested a supplemental appropriation of \$294.00 to purchase additional filing equipment. Upon motion of Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Chandler and carried the request was granted.

IN RE: NAMOZINE VOL. FIRE DEPARTMENT - REQUEST FUNDS TO PURCHASE USED PUMPER.

Mr. A. M. Smith reported the Namozine Vol. Fire Department could purchase a used pumper truck for approximately \$800.00 to be used by the department. Mr. Smith moved the Board of Supervisors participate in the purchase of this pumper in an amount not to exceed five hundred dollars. Mr. Chandler seconded. The motion carried.

IN RE: CLOSED DOOR MEETINGS - EDITORIAL IN SOUTHSIDE VIRGINIAN.


The Chairman reported there appeared in the Southside Virginian (a supplement to the Richmond Times Dispatch) an editorial accusing the Dinwiddie County and other Southside Va. Counties of holding closed door meetings of the Board of Supervisors. The Chairman rebutted the statement and acknowledged that the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County held no closed door meetings. The Executive Secretary was directed to write the Southside Virginian and request a public retraction of such accusations.

IN RE: DINWIDDIE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT - REV. WADE MUNFORD.

The Rev. Wade Munford, Member of Dinwiddie Volunteer Fire Department appeared before the Board and requested some type of communications be install on the Dinwiddie Fire Truck, Mr. Munford also requested the County provide insurance to protect the volunteer fireman from loss of personel effects and clothing and to furnish an additional piece of equipment for use by the Dinwiddie Department. Such requests were referred back to the Department and the Executive Secretary for further study.

There being no further business to be presented to the Board the meeting was adjourned at 9:25 P.M.
