APPOINTMENT OF ROAD VIEWERS:

On motion duly made and carried, the Board doth appoint C. Y. Avery, Arthur Prosise, Lunsford Butterworth and Will Green, Road Viewers, resident free holders of this County, any three of whom may act as viewers to view the roads that will be referred to them, during the fiscal year 1962-63 and to report to this Board as soon as practical after each view as follows:

- l. The conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public, if the said roads shall be built:
- 2. Whether any yard, garden or orchard or any part thereof will, in such case, have to be taken;
- 3. Whether the said proposed roads will be of such mere private convenience as to make it proper that the same shall be established and kept in order by the person or persons for whose convenience it is desired;
- 4. They may examine roads other than the one proposed and report upon the one they prefer with the reasons for their preference.
- 5. They will state the names of the land owners and the tenants, if any, on the said proposed roads;
 - 6. Which of said land owners require compensation;
- 7. What will be a just compensation to each of those requiring the same for the land taken, and the damage to the residue of the tracts beyond the peculiar benefits to be derived in respect to such residue from the roads so proposed;
- 8. And they will state any other fact or circumstance useful in enabling the Board to determine the expedience of establisheing, opening or altering the proposed road; and they will return with their report a diagram or map showing the roads thereof; and an estimate of the probable cost of the same.
